

# Land for Rewilding

## Guidelines for Selecting Rewilding Sites

A successful rewilding project begins with choosing the right location. The ideal site should meet several important criteria:

### Site History and Condition

The land must be free from environmental liabilities that require remediation. This excludes abandoned well sites, gravel pits, and similar industrial locations. Former agricultural land presents an excellent opportunity for rewilding. Common challenges such as established grass coverage, existing vegetation (whether native or invasive), and soil compaction can be effectively addressed through our site mitigation processes.

### Size Requirements

While we prefer sites larger than 10 hectares to maximize ecological impact, there is no upper size limit. Larger areas typically provide better opportunities for establishing diverse ecosystems and supporting wildlife populations.

### Cultural & Ecological Significance

We encourage you to consider sites that hold cultural or ecological significance to your Nation. These locations often offer additional benefits beyond environmental restoration, providing traditional land-use opportunities and habitat for wildlife.
